


Vision:




Help Me Grow WA System Model


Help Me Grow WA Network (2024)






In 2024, Help Me Grow WA responded to 16,496 requests for support, serving 12,122 children and 892 pregnant people


Requests for Support




Help Me Grow Washington provided 133,742 resources and referrals Food security and family stability resources were the most common referrals




1 in 3 people preferred a language other than English HMG served people in 43 different languages




Most children were under age 3

Community Partner Board (est. July 2023)

- Responsible for representing local and community perspectives, interests, and needs/gaps in order to develop and strengthen the connectivity between the state and local HMG systems within the network
- Comprised of local and state representatives as well as emerging community partners

Coordinating Team

(est. Jan 2024)

- The backbone for the HMG WA network
- Responsible for coordinating and planning for strategic initiatives across the system
- Comprised of the WA state
 Department of Children,
 Youth, and Families (DCYF)
 and the WA state Help Me
 Grow affiliate, WithinReach

Stewardship Council

(est. March 2025)

- Responsible for ensuring HMG WA system is making progress toward achieving the goals and objectives set by the network

Started in Spring 2024 with a referral pilot. Evolved into an automated system for seamless, efficient referrals launched July 1.

What

- Expand developmental screenings across all ECE types
- Strengthen relationships with providers statewide
- Pilot 1 and 2

Who

- 19 ECE providers
- Types of providers include Center based, family home, and Play & Learn group
- Locations: Benton, Spokane, Kitsap, Yakima, Pend Oreille, Kitsap, Stevens, Douglas, Snohomish, Franklin, and **Skagit Counties**
- Pilot 1: 138 screenings
- Pilot 2: 117 screenings




LOOKING AHEAD: 2025-2026

Targeted Universalism

- Working with Seva Workshop to develop a Theory of Change that connects universal goal, sub-goals, and targeted strategies.
- Next phase developing and implementing strategies to support priority populations.

Connecting with Tribes and tribal communities

- Continuing to build and strength relationships
- Explore emerging partnerships and collaborations like resource directories and referral pathways



System Cost Modeling

- Continue developing and refining HMG System Cost Models to better understand the costs associated with providing services at different levels of intensity and the resources needed for a program to remain financially solvent
 - HMG WA Local System
 - HMG WA State Level System
 - HMG WA Specialized Referral Pathways

Systems Collaboration

 Continue exploring system level relationships e.g. Early Childhood Courts, Early Support for Infants & Toddlers (ESIT), StrongStart (DOH), & Infant-Early Childhood Mental Health Systems (HCA)
